



TCA Long-term learning mobility of school pupils

- *Rationale:* Long-term learning mobility of school pupils contributes to the impact of the activities on the institutional level, and offers enormous potential towards the internationalisation and opening up of schools. From the pupils' point of view, the activity reinforces their understanding of the diversity of European cultures and languages, and helps them acquire the competences necessary for their personal development. Long-term study mobility of pupils can also be a valuable international pedagogical experience for schools and teachers involved. The activity offers pupils and teachers a wide repertoire of opportunities: distinct cultural perspectives, different educational environments and teaching practices, new social atmospheres, better understanding and appreciation for other nation's people and history. It provides as well considerable room for personal growth.
- *Objectives.* This TCA aims at:
 - o Working on the added value of long-term learning mobility of school pupils.
 - o Providing working strategies to manage long-term pupil mobility.
 - o Defining tools to improve and measure the impact on schools.
 - o Show-casing good practices.
 - o Creating a networking environment which facilitates finding partners for the Erasmus+ call 2023.
- *Profile of participants:* The TCA is targeted at education professionals (teachers, head teachers) of schools interested in the implementation of long-term pupil mobility. Schools with Erasmus accreditation in school education will have priority, but the activity will also be open to non-accredited schools. The activity

will focus on secondary schools (both lower and upper secondary Education).
